- Global governance failures & politics (far right, nationalism, erosion of democracy, racial capitalism)
- Self-centeredness, greed and myopia of rich nations
- Anti-science aggression & misinformation ("infodemic")
- Big pharma monopolies and profiteering
- Weak capacity for vaccine and drug manufacturing in LMICs (except for India & China)
- Huge drop in routine immunizations and increase in vaccine hesitancy
- Conflict and climate crisis create a perfect storm for outbreaks to emerge & sustain
- Weak health systems (nearly half the world lacks access to essential health services)

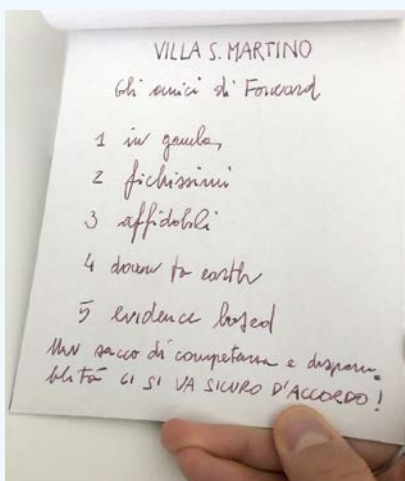

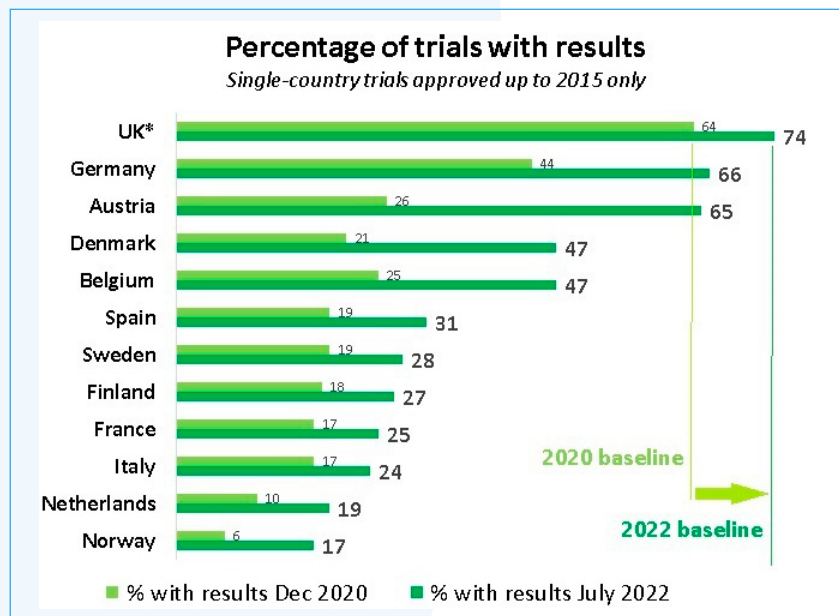
